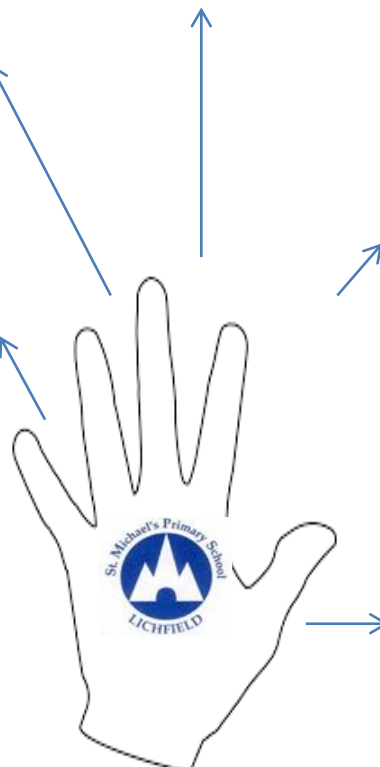
Subject leaders play an important part in the success of the curriculum by providing colleagues with effective support for planning, resourcing and teaching. Subject leaders have staff meeting time to monitor their subject and lead staff training and development. They have ownership of their subjects and have created subject progressions and visions which are published on the website.

High quality texts are used in all year groups to promote reading skills, a high level of vocabulary and extended sentence structures.

Pupil progress meetings are held termly, to discuss the progress of every child and to put in additional interventions as required.
