Children build on the knowledge they have mastered

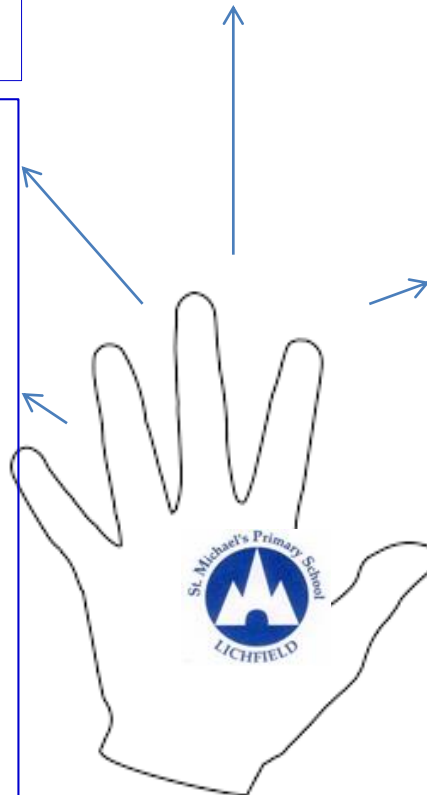
Mathematical knowledge is broadened during lessons with children given opportunities to explain their understanding through reasoning.
