



Tuesday 13 th May	English reading test, reading booklet and associated answer booklet. (60 minutes)
Wednesday 14 th May	Mathematics, Paper 1, arithmetic test. (30 minutes) Mathematics, Paper 2, reasoning. (40 minutes)
Thursday 15 th May	Mathematics Paper 3, reasoning. (40 minutes)
